OUR LADY OF CHARITY OF EL COBRE September 8

About the year 1600, three men from Santiago del Prado (now known as El Cobre), Cuba, were out in their small boat on the Bay of Nipe when they saw a white bundle floating slowly toward them. It was a statue of the Virgin Mary holding the child on her left arm and with a gold cross in her right hand. The statue was fastened to a board with the inscription, "I am the Virgin of Charity."

SAINT PETER CLAVER (1581-1654) September 9

Nearly two hundred years before the Declaration of Independence proclaimed "that all men are created equal," two hundred fifty years before the Emancipation Proclamation mandated an end to slavery, three hundred fifty years before Martin Luther King's "I Have a Dream", and four hundred years before the election of an American president boasting African heritage, Peter Claver left his native Spain behind to volunteer for the Jesuit missions in Colombia. There, he was horrified both by slavery as an institution and by the inhuman brutality inflicted upon the slaves. He solemnly vowed to become "the slave of the slaves," and lived that vow heroically for close to forty years. Not knowing their language, Peter began his ministry among the slaves by using the universal language of practical charity, providing medical care and a tangible though wordless assertion of their human dignity: "We spoke to them not with words but with our hands, kneeling beside them, bathing their faces and bodies, encouraging them with friendly gestures" (see Liturgy of the Hours, Volume 4, p. 2018). Then came evangelization and baptism. Holiness as human wholeness: Peter Claver's enduring witness. —Peter Scagnelli


Our country, our military, police and first responders all need our prayers

SAINT JOHN CHRYSOSTOM (c. 344-407) September 13

"Speaking truth to power" may have become just another cliché, but doing precisely that cost John "the Golden Mouth" (Chrysostom) his diocese and, after exile and a forced march, his health and life. "Renowned for eloquence, heroic in suffering" (Sacramentary), John's scriptural insights still comfort and challenge. Mystical theologian, he bids Eastern Christians, whose principal Divine Liturgy bears his name, to lift up their hearts to "God ineffable, beyond comprehension, invisible, beyond understanding, existing forever, always the same." Model pastor, he warns Roman Catholics in the Liturgy of the Hours not to neglect God-in-the-flesh: "Would you honor Christ's body? Do not scorn his nakedness, honoring him here in church with silken robes, while neglecting him cold and naked outside. What use to burden Christ's altar with golden chalices, while Christ himself starves to death? What use dressing the altar with gold-woven cloths, while denying the shivering Christ the clothes he needs? Do not adorn the church while ignoring your needy brother: he is the most precious temple of all!" (Saturday, Twenty-first Week in Ordinary Time). —Peter Scagnelli



HISPANIC MINISTRY

Le messe in spagnolo si svolgono la prima e la terza domenica alle 1:00 PM.

SAN PEDRO CLAVER (1581-1654) 9 de septiembre

Nació en la región de Cataluña, España. Siendo joven estudió en la Universidad de Barcelona, dirigida por los padres jesuitas. En 1602 fue admitido por los Jesuitas y profesó sus primeros votos. Luego de su noviciado se formó bajo la dirección de san Alfonso Rodríguez, quien fue para él un verdadero maestro y modelo de santidad. Luego de estudiar teología es enviado a la actual Colombia, donde fue ordenado sacerdote y quedó marcado profundamente al ver cómo trataban a los esclavos africanos traídos de Angola, en una travesía marítima que duraba hasta ocho semanas. No sólo era la trata de esclavos, sino las condiciones tan deplorables en que llegaban a Colombia. Él, sin hablar el idioma, se apresuraba a recibirlos ofreciéndoles medicina, pan y un trato digno. Solía decir que "antes de hablarles con los labios había que hablarles con las manos". Se convirtió en un servidor y protector de ellos, llamándose a sí mismo: "esclavo de los esclavos". Fue un apóstol incansable pues se preocupó de su bienestar espiritual así como de que se practicara la justicia hacia ellos. -Miguel Arias

NUESTRA SEÑORA DE LA CARIDAD DEL COBRE 8 de septiembre

Allá por el año 1600, tres hombres de Santiago del Prado (ahora conocido como El Cobre), Cuba, estaban en su pequeño barco en la Bahía de Nipe cuando vieron un bulto blanco que flotaba lentamente hacia ellos. Era la estatua de la Virgen María que sostenía a un niño en el brazo izquierdo y a una cruz de oro en la mano derecha. La estatua estaba en una tablita pequeña que llevaba la inscripción: "Yo soy la Virgen de la Caridad".

Treasures From Our Tradition

In recent years, there has been remarkable progress in drawing persons with disabilities into full celebration. Now it is generally accepted that worship places need accommodations such as ramps or elevators, large-print materials for those who are sight-impaired, and perhaps even an assisted hearing system or signing in American Sign Language. American Sign Language is not merely English translated into movement, but a distinct language with its own grammar, syntax (word order), and vocabulary. For this reason, the American Catholic bishops have approved American Sign Language (ASL) as an official language of the liturgy.

Celebrating liturgy in our own language (the vernacular) means that liturgy must be accessible to all languages and cultures. The fact that Mass is celebrated this weekend in some places in total silence, but with the full participation of deaf people praising God in the movements of their hands, and sometimes even with a priest who is deaf, is nothing less than the Church being faithful to the image of Jesus, who made the deaf hear and the mute speak. Remember too that deafness is an invisible disability, and that there may well be people in your parish who are quietly yearning for Mass to be signed for them in ASL.
