

OUR LADY OF EINSIEDELN September 14

The tradition of devotion to Our Lady at the shrine in Einsiedeln, Switzerland, began with the hermit Meinrad in 853, when he place a statue of the Blessed Mother with the infant Jesus in a small chapel near his cell. It is thought that the present statue, known as the Black Madonna, was carved in 1466.



OUR LADY OF SORROWS September 15

Mary is venerated under this title to commemorate the seven sorrows that she suffered: The prophecy of Simeon, the flight into Egypt, the loss of the child Jesus in the temple, meeting Jesus carrying his cross, the Crucifixion, receiving the body of Jesus from the cross, and the burial of Jesus. A devotional image of her shows her heart pierced with seven swords to represent these sorrows.

OUR LADY OF LA SALETTE September 19

In 1846, at La Salette in France, the Blessed Mother appeared to two young teens, Maximin Giraud and Mélanie Calvat. She told them to make her message "known to all my people." The La Salette missionary order is founded on the reconciling message of this apparition.



Sacrament of Baptism and Confirmation Role of Sponsors

Video & Discussion after St. Anthony's 8:15 Mass — Wednesdays Starting September 17th—Friendship Hall Meeting Room. Featuring the Metanoia videos with Fr. Dave Pivonka. Metanoia contains 10, half hour episodes shot in locations all throughout the Holy Land. The audience will be able to encounter the Lord in the settings of some of the holiest sights in the world. Metanoia is a spiritual journey through the places where Jesus physically taught His Church the meaning and the way of metanoia. It is a transformation of the heart, a spiritual conversion, which comes about through repentance. This conversion may be in how we see Jesus, the Father, our self, and others. This follow-up series focuses on eight different areas that invite us to a deeper metanoia of who Jesus is and how He desires us to know Him. When one views this series, the viewer will have a much broader understanding of Jesus' message.

Bearing our Crosses with Joy

We may have any number of crosses throughout our lives. Some may be small, some may be big. Some may be heavy, some may be light. Some may be temporary, some may be long lasting. As Christians, we are called to bear those burdens, not begrudgingly but joyfully. Sometimes that seems downright impossible. How can I have joy in my life when every moment is filled with pain (whether that be physical or emotional)?

The answer is, it is not possible without a profound relationship with our Lord, that includes constant surrender to His will. In His great love for us, He often allows things to happen that we don't understand, but are for our good or for the good of others. Afterall, the goal for each of us is eternal salvation, not earthly comfort.

But whether we suffer rejection, loneliness, illness, pain, hunger, cold, or even torture and death, we know that He has experienced it all and knows exactly how it feels. We can ask Him to walk with us each step of the way and be our strength when our own fails.

We may get to the point where we are able to rejoice in our sufferings like St. Paul, or endure them without complaint or remember to offer them up. But above all, may our crosses be a constant reminder to us of today's powerful Gospel passage: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (John 3:16).

HISPANIC MINISTRY

Le messe in spagnolo si svolgono la prima e la terza domenica alle 1:00 PM.

NUESTRA SEÑORA DE EINSIEDELN 14 de septiembre

La tradición de la devoción a Nuestra Señora en el santuario de Einsiedeln, Suiza comenzó con el ermita Meinrad en 853, cuando colocó una estatua de la Santísima Madre con el Niño Jesús en una pequeña capilla cerca de su celda. Se piensa que la estatua presente, conocida como la Virgen Negra, fue tallada en 1466.

SANTOS CORNELIO (año 253) Y CIPRIANO (año 258) 16 de septiembre

Cornelio era un ciudadano romano que sucedió a san Fabián en el papado, luego de 14 meses sin obispo. El candidato que aspiraba al cargo le creó serios problemas, pues calificó de ilegítima la elección papal de Cornelio. Además, se oponía a que se recibiera en la Iglesia a los apóstatas, mientras que el Papa Cornelio sostenía que sí, que podían ser readmitidos luego de una penitencia. En el 253 se declaró una persecución contra los cristianos y Cornelio fue desterrado sufriendo el cautiverio y posteriormente la decapitación. Durante su destierro recibió una carta del obispo Cipriano, quien le felicitaba por sufrir en nombre de Cristo. Este obispo se había convertido a los 45 años al cristianismo, renunciando a su vida placentera y abrazando no sólo el Evangelio, sino también a los autores cristianos, entre ellos a Tertuliano, quien le influyó notablemente. Gracias a su conocimiento de oratoria y retórica impulsó enormemente el cristianismo en África. Como obispo, fue firme y caritativo, enfrentó la persecución y fue decapitado. Ambos, Cipriano y Cornelio son recordados en la Plegaria Eucarística I del Rito Romano.—Miguel Arias

Treasures From Our Tradition

On this date in 335 two churches and a shrine erected by Constantine over the empty grave of Jesus and over the place of the crucifixion were dedicated. After these were destroyed by the Persians in 614, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, which still stands, was erected by the Crusaders in 1149. Today also commemorates the event that led to the building of the churches dedicated in 335: the discovery of the "true cross" by St. Helena, Constantine's mother, in 326.

According to one legend, St. Helena traveled to Jerusalem on pilgrimage, in search of the true cross. Workers she hired dug through a pagan temple that had been erected on the site of the Crucifixion by Hadrian and found three crosses. A dying woman was brought in, and touched by each cross in succession, the last of which healed her. Helena ordered that this cross be divided in three parts, one to be kept in Jerusalem and the other two to be sent to Constantinople and Rome. The pieces in Jerusalem and Constantinople were ultimately lost. Slivers were taken from the portion that went to Rome until eventually it was scattered around the world.

Of course, the significance of the true cross lies not in the wood itself but in the burden that it bore. As a faithful Christian, what crosses do you accept in your life today?
